Notes on the database

Nos. 1 to 5 relate to Local history in England.

Nos. 6-9 reflect the importance of PRONI in the early promotion of local history.

Nos. 10-22 refer to books and articles which provided the rationale for local history in schools, the sources that could be used, where they might be found and possible approaches to studying local history in schools.

Nos. 23-48 are examples of work done in the 1980s by individuals (usually seconded to PRONI, UFTM or UAFP) or groups of teachers supported by Area Boards and Teachers' Centres. Remember during the 1980s Local History was the Coursework element in GCSE History and was often used in primary schools as the main vehicle for teaching history.

Nos. 49 onwards reflect the NIC and Cultural Heritage and the Heritage and Family History 'Industries'.

There is a separate worksheet that lists books of photographs. Those dated 1988 onwards reflect the rise of the 'Heritage Industry'.
